2. PURPOSE

Coordinate, advice and manage all Road Safety Programmes involved by the design branch for a safe and effective integrated road network programmes on all national, provincial and district road network programmes funded through the National Governments Infrastructural Development Programmes in Papua New Guinea.

3. DIMENSIONS

- 3.1 Accountable to Assistant Secretary (HEB) on engineering and technical issues of road safety implementation programs that involves Road Safety Audit Investigations, Road Safety Training Workshops, Black Spot data collection/investigations, Accident & Crash data to implement on the National Governments Infrastructural Development Programmes on Road Transport (Roads & Bridges) Network in Papua New Guinea.
- **3.2** Liaise through Assistant Secretary (HEB) to advise DoW field staff in the provinces on road safety audits, training workshops and other related issues of the road safety programmes involved by the Design Branch.
- **3.3** Coordinate and manage existing road safety data (workshops, black spot & crash data) including existing and new data for improved safety performance and implementation of the National Road Transport Network in Papua New Guinea.

4. PRINCIPLE ACCOUNTABILITIES

- **4.1** Accountable to Assistant Secretary (HEB) to ensure all road safety programmes involved by the design branch are implemented on all sixteen (16) priority national roads identified under the Medium-Term Transport Development Plans (MTTDP) and National Road Network Strategy (NRNS) programmes including other sub-national roads throughout the country.
- **4.2** Through Assistant Secretary (HEB) ensure that all road safety guidelines and policy requirements are complied with and included on these road projects designed and constructed. This includes the existing roads that are open to public use throughout the country.
- **4.3** Through Assistant Secretary (HEB) ensure that all road approaches to bridge crossings and including cross drainage culvert crossings safety guard rails are installed/replaced with the approved "Bull Nose" end terminal through all sixteen (16) priority national roads and other sub-national roads throughout the country.


- **4.4** Through Assistant Secretary (HEB) assist to arrange road safety training programs and other related training requirements for implementation of safer road projects for all road users throughout the country.
- 4.5 Through Assistant Secretary (HEB) to revise and improve road safety standards and technology practices for implementation on the various road/bridge programmes as stated in the annual work plans.
- **4.6** Through Assistant Secretary (HEB) administer and ensure Annual Budget Allocations on Recurrent Budget are sufficient to purchase office equipment and materials required for the smooth operation of the design branch.

5. MAJOR DUTIES

- **5.1** Coordinate and manage road safety section involved in all road safety functions & tasks on various road projects involved by the design branch in line with the MTTDP's and NRNS's programmes.
 - (i) Develop and implement all relevant road safety guidelines, manuals and standards in close consultation with road & bridge sections for the implementation road network programmes.
 - (II) Provide advice on road safety requirements for various road classification standards to other line Departments and Agencies.
 - (III)Prepare consultancy design briefs for engagement of consultants to assist DoW with its road safety functions & programmes when required.
 - (iv)Develop programmes and strategies for successful completion road safety audits on all road/bridge projects involved by the design branch for implementation of the road network plans & systems.
- **5.2** Coordinate and monitor the road safety section staff performances, taking appropriate corrective measures to ensure efficient and effective performances of staff are achieved.
- **5.3** Ensure implementation of all Government, Department and Divisional Policies within road safety section and the design branch are implemented.
- **5.4** Advice and inform Assistant Secretary (HEB) on operational activities involved and progress of road safety section within the design branch.
- **5.5** Participate in the management of the design branch by providing relevant information and advice to Assistant Secretary (HEB) when required.
- **5.6** Through Assistant Secretary (HEB) liaise with other line departments and organizations on relevant road safety guidelines and standards where applicable.
- **5.7** Assist with training and development of staff through Human Resources Development Branch (HRDB) through Assistant Secretary (HEB).
- 5.8 Other relevant duties and tasks as directed by the Assistant Secretary (HEB).

6. NATURE AND SCOPE

This position is within the management level of the Design Branch and reports directly to the Activity Head (Assistant Secretary – Highway Engineering Branch) as depicted in the structural framework of the branch.



6.1 WORKING RELATIONSHIP

(a) Interna

Reporting through Assistant Secretary (Highway Engineering Branch) to liaise with other Branches, Divisions within Department of Works Headquarters and Provincial Establishments when required to implement all road safety programmes involved by the design branch.

(b) External

Liaise through Assistant Secretary (HEB) with Road Traffic Authority (RTA) and other line Departments, Authorities, Agencies, Consultants, Members of Parliament and General Public on technical issues relating to DoW approved road safety guidelines and awareness programs in Papua New Guinea.

6.2 WORK ENVIRONMENT

Coordinate and manage through Assistant Secretary (HEB) to implement all road safety audits and programs relating to road safety requirements, guidelines and standards on behalf of Department of Works (DoW) for the National Government of Papua New Guinea on Road Transport (Roads & Bridges) network for a safe and easy accessibility for the people of Papua New Guinea.

7. CONSTRAINTS FRAMEWORK AND BOUNDARIES

Rules/procedures

- The National Government through Department of Transport's National Road Network Strategy (NRNS) Policy Guidelines for Road Transport Networks for upgrading and rehabilitation works has identified the sixteen (16) priority road network sections including the missing links in the Medium-Term Transport Development Programmes (MTTDP's).
- Department of Works (DoW) shall be confined and limited to meet these policy guidelines as stated in the MTTDP and NRNS as a result when implementing these development projects.
- All engineering designs, documentation and Road Safety requirements shall be focused on these road networks within the country subject to annual development budget funding as a result od these policy guidelines.

Decision

 The Government through Department of Transport has the mandated role and obligation to decide and include other relevant sections of road network throughout the country into MTTDP, NRNS and Sub-National Roads for implementing that will open accessibility to the rural population for economic and social developments. This decision will not only alleviate poverty but also improve living conditions of the rural population through delivery of services such as health, education and other social improvements as well as agricultural developments.

Recommendations

 It is recommended that other policy guidelines be developed to include other missing sections of road network and funding to be made available through the Department of National Planning and Monitoring (DNP&M).

8. CHALLENGES

- The current challenge with respect to this position is the recruitment of experience road safety engineer to this position to support/perform the specific duties and tasks involved in order to produce the required outcomes and meet deadlines on the various road safety programmes/projects involved by the design branch.
- Young graduate engineers considered for this position will take years to train in order to gain confidence and experience required on various road safety options and applications practiced in road safety programmes and the construction industry.
- The design branch has been unable to attract and employ experienced and qualified engineers for the last three (3) decades due to low salary and employment conditions which are governed by the Governments Public Service Renumeration conditions.

9. QUALIFICATIONS, EXPERIENCES AND SKILLS

(a) Qualifications

- Appropriate university degree in Civil engineering studies from a recognized university.
- Registered member of Institute of Engineers Papua New Guinea (IEPNG).

(b) Knowledge

- Significant experience in road safety programmes in design and construction phases on variety of road/bridge projects ranging from rural to urban applications.
- Significant knowledge on various types of road safety audits, safety barriers used and identification of road side hazards for road safety engineering applications.
- Significant knowledge on the types of road safety requirements (policies, manuals & road side hazards) to comply with the approved DoW approved road safety implementation programmes.

(c) Skills

 Significant experience in various road safety guidelines and practices from Rural to Urban setting requirements to ensure the approved DoW road design guidelines and policies are complied with when implementing these road safety programmes.

(d) Work Experience

 Minimum experience of ten (10) years in road/bridge engineering applications on design, construction & road safety policies and guidelines.
